CHAPTER 3 ANIMALS AND THEIR FEEDING HABITS

Herbivore A plant or animal that eats plants ONLY.	Carnivore A plant or animal that eats animals ONLY.	Omnivore A plant or animal that eats both plants and animals.

Teeth of herbivores: they have flat and broad front teeth to bite of leaves and swallow their food.

- Some herbivorous bring back the food from the stomach to the mouth and chew it for hours, this is called chewing the cud. Ex-cow, horse, deer, sheep etc.
- Rabbits, rats, and squirrels have sharp front teeth to bite nuts fruits and seeds, this is called gnawing.

Teeth of carnivores: they have sharp and pointed front teeth to tear the flesh of other animals.

- Spider weaves a web to trap insects.
- Snakes and frog swallow their food as a whole.
- Leech sucks the blood through suckers present on their body.

Teeth of omnivores: they have both sharp pointed teeth like carnivores and flat broad teeth like herbivores.

Food chain

A chain that shows who eats whom is called food chain. It starts with producers (green plants).
