



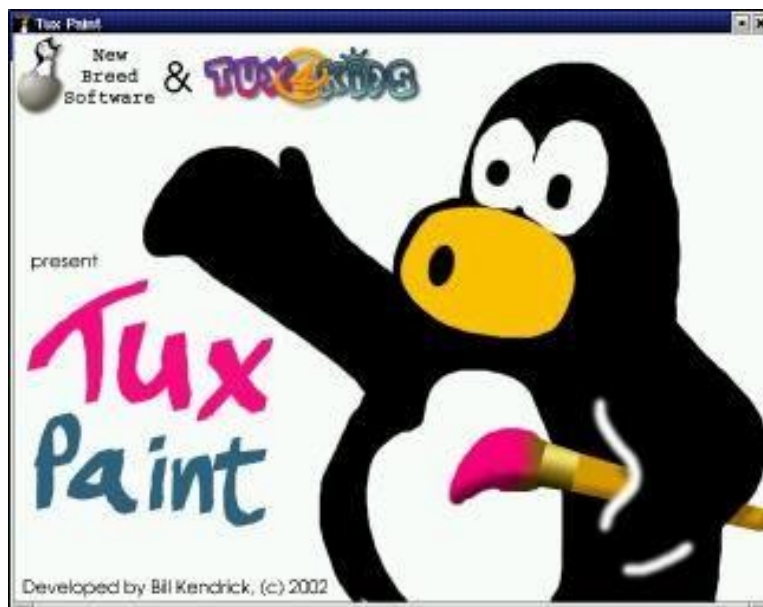

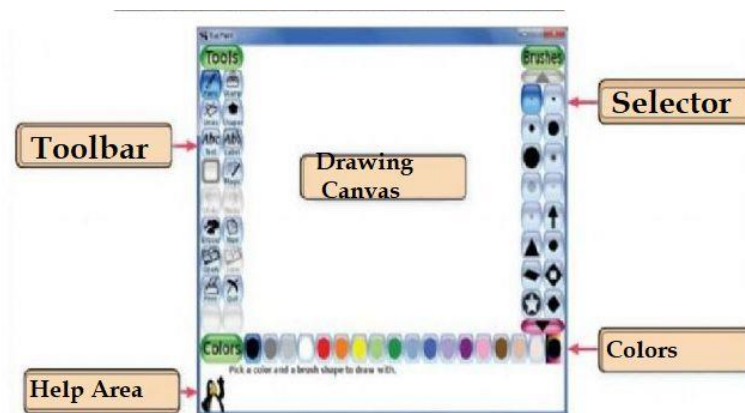
CHAPTER 6

COMPUTER

Tux Penguin guides you as you draw.



1. Let's revise the parts of the Tux Paint window and learn more about them.



Toolbar – It contains all the tools that you can use for drawing.

Selector Pane – This pane shows the different options available for each tools such as different sizes for brushes and pencils.

Colours Palette – It contains the various colours that you can use to draw and paint.

Help Area – This is the area where Tux, the penguin, gives you hints and tips to help you draw and paint.

Drawing Canvas – This is the place where you draw and paint.

How To Open Tux Paint

Select the **Start** button > **Tux Paint** > **Tux Paint (Full Screen)**

- You can now see the welcome screen of **Tux Paint**.
- After the welcome screen, you will get the opening screen of **Tux Paint**.



SAVING A DRAWING

- Click on **Save** tool from the toolbar
- Click Yes button (It will save the file).

CLOSING A DRAWING

- Click on **Quit** tool
- Click Yes button (if you want to close)
- Click again Yes button if you want to save the file before closing.

OPENING A DRAWING

- Click on the **Open** tool
- Select the drawing you want to open
- Click on the Open button.

PRINTING A DRAWING

- Open the drawing that you want to print
- Select **Print** tool in the Tools bar
- A box appears on the screen.
- Click Yes to print.
